

When families cannot access support at home or in care facilities, their loved ones can feel abandoned or forced into choices they never wanted like medically provided death (known as MAiD) Together, we can urge provincial leaders to strengthen palliative care, invest in home supports, and ensure that every person receives care that honours life at every stage.
